

Future Plans

Showcasing Israeli Resilience

As we continue document and amplify survivor stories, Survived to Tell is expanding its VR offerings to capture the broader Israeli reality. With five October 7th testimonies already filmed, the next phase will spotlight the courage, complexity, and collective spirit shaping Israel's recovery through new immersive experiences:

- **Everyday Heroes:** Uplifting the voices of those who quietly and courageously carry the nation forward—civilians and professionals alike who are rebuilding lives, communities, and hope. From first responders and wounded soldiers to teachers and volunteers, their actions embody the unshakable will to heal and rebuild.
- **Druze & Northern Communities:** Sharing untold stories from Israel's northern border—capturing the strength and unity of diverse communities, including Druze and Jewish residents of Kiryat Shmona, Metula, and Majdal Shams, who continue to stand together amid ongoing threats and uncertainty.

The Visitor Center

Our newly launched Survived to Tell Visitor Center in Sderot is a groundbreaking educational hub that blends immersive VR, multimedia, and Al-driven storytelling to bring the firsthand accounts of Oct. 7th survivors to life. More than a place of remembrance, it is a space for renewal, dialogue, and empowerment—poised to become a must-visit site in the Gaza Envelope for thousands in the years ahead.
