Mission Briefing: Operation Blue & White

Subject: **URGENT** – National Security Breach



4. This symbol represents a religion with a famous prophet that used a cave in the Carmel mountain as a hiding place







Jerusalem

- Jerusalem is the biggest city in Israel by both geography and population
- Jerusalem is home to the biggest synagogue in Israel
- Jerusalem is the official capital of the state of Israel
- the oldest olive tree in the world, aged 800 years old, can be found in Jerusalem
- In 1967, during the Six-Day War, Jerusalem was reunited after 19 years of division
- Neil Armstrong, the first man to walk on the moon, stated upon his visit to Jerusalem that he was “much more excited to walk on the city’s steps than when I walked on the moon”
- Jerusalem has over 70 names and nicknames
- The biggest stone in the Kotel (Western Wall) weighs 570 Tons
- The old city of Jerusalem is home to 4 communities—Jews, Muslims, Christians and Armenians

Eilat

- Eilat is the southernmost city in the state of Israel, and the only city located next to the red sea
- Eilat is a popular diving destination in Israel
- Eilat’s previous name was “Umm Rashrash”
- Eilat is home to a world renowned coral reef, with extraordinary wildlife and a shipwreck of a navy ship.
- Eilat is located on the border between Egypt and Jordan, with Israel signing a peace agreement with Egypt in 1979 and with Jordan in 1994
- During Israel’s war of independence, after Eilat was liberated in 1949, troops did not have a proper Israeli flag to raise above the city. They then had to paint a flag using ins and a white sheet and raised it above it’s port, a flag that will later be named “The Ink Flag”
- Eilat is one of Israel’s most famous tourist destination.

Kibbutz Nir Oz

- Kibbutz Nir-Oz is world-renowned for its botanical garden, which features over 900 species of plants adapted to arid climates
- Kibbutz Nir Oz was established in 1955 as a Nahal settlement on the border of the Negev desert
- On October 7th, 2023, Nir Oz was one of the hardest-hit communities, with about a quarter of its residents either murdered or abducted
- Despite the immense tragedy, the surviving community remains a symbol of Israeli strength as they fight for the return of their loved ones

The more you know

Haifa

- Haifa is home to Israel's only underground metro, the Carmelit, which is considered the shortest underground train in the world!
- Haifa is home to the Bahá'í Gardens, a UNESCO World Heritage site, a holy place for the Bahá'í faith who sees Haifa as its world center
- Elijah's Cave is located at the foot of Mount Carmel in Haifa and it is believed its walls had mystical healing powers for mental illnesses
- Haifa port was founded in 104 BCE, almost 2,100 years ago.
- Haifa is a mixed city, with a large Jewish, Muslim, Druze and Christian population
- Every December Haifa hosts the "Holiday of Holidays" celebrating the winter holidays of all faiths.
- Haifa University is considered quite young, being the 5th out of the 7 universities to be built in Israel

The more you know

Sde-Boker

- Boker consists of three different centers: Kibbutz Sde Boker (where Ben-Gurion lived), Midreshet Ben-Gurion (an educational and tourist center), and the Agricultural School.
- he name "Sde Boker" is a translation of the Arabic name for the area - "Shigeret al-Baker" (the Cattle Tree).
- The first settlers established the kibbutz in 1952 as a cattle farm, even though all the experts said that it was impossible to raise cattle in the heart of the desert. They proved it was possible.
- David Ben-Gurion, Israel's first Prime Minister, was a member of the Kibbutz and him and Paula his wife are buried in a simple grave plot on the edge of the cliff on the premises.
- David Ben-Gurion, who made Aliya from Poland in 1906, during the rule of the British empire, was elected twice to be Israel's prime minister. His Passion was to revive the desert and even has a university name after him.
- In Sde-Boker you can find his living shack which by his request remained exactly as it was. If you visit there, you can still see the world map he used to look at and his independent library, containing thousands of books in different languages.

The more you know

Kiryat Shmona

- Kiryat Shmona was founded in 1949 and absorbed many immigrants from Morocco, Romania, Yemen and other countries
- In 1974 it was declared a city!
- The city's name commemorates the eight heroes of the battle of Tel Hai who fell in 1920, led by Yosef Trumpeldor
- The city is located at the northernmost point in Israel and is of paramount strategic importance due to its proximity to the borders of Lebanon and Syria
- Kiryat Shmona is the smallest city in Israel whose football team won the state championship
- In 1958, a record rainfall was measured, in which 81 millimeters of rain fell in just 90 minutes – an amount equivalent to an entire month in an hour and a half!
- It is the Home to Tel-Hai College
- Following the Iron Swords War, the city of Kiryat Shmona was evacuated due to the security challenge and is slowly trying to rebuild itself and return its residents to their homes and communities

The more you know

Mount Hermon

- Mount Hermon is the tallest mountain in Israel with it's tallest point being 2,814 meters (9,232 ft)
- Mount Hermon is the only place in the world the Colchicum (a type of flower) can be found
- It is also the rainiest point in all of Israel and is located at the northernmost part of the state
- The mountain sits on the border between Israel, Syria and Lebanon
- Mount Hermon is the only place in Israel where people can ski
- The snowmelt from the Hermon is one of Israel's main water sources.
- Mount Hermon's elevation makes it Israel's primary strategic early warning system

The more you know

Tel-Aviv

- Tel-Aviv is among the most expensive cities in the world!
- Tel-Aviv used to have a different name when it was just founded - Achuzat Bayit
- It is home to Israel's tallest skyscraper - the Sarona Azrieli Tower
- Tel-Aviv's fourth mayor, Moshe Shlush, was in office for only four days!
- Israel's declaration of independence, which was signed in 1948, took place in Tel-Aviv on Rothchild street
- The city was founded in 1909
- Tel Aviv is home to Tel Aviv University, the largest university in the country
- Tel Aviv is ranked as the greenest city in Israel
- Tel Aviv receives about 2.5 million international visitors annually
- Tel Aviv is known as "the city that never sleeps" and a "party capital" due to its thriving nightlife, young atmosphere and famous 24-hour culture
